



# News and Views

The Torah reading for Yom Kippur is the description of the Yom Kippur Temple service. The pinnacle of this service was the most intimate moment of Divine-human contact in the year. The High Priest, representing the nation of Israel meets 'God', Who descends to the Holy of Holies in a cloud. This achieves atonement for the people. God instructed Moshe to say to his brother Aharon that even he,the High Priest, may only enter the Holy of Holies on Yom Kippur, with a bull for a sin offering, along with a ram for a burnt offering. The Jewish people were to bring two goats for a sin offering and a ram for a burnt offering.

Aharon wears four special, white garments. He is to take two goats and draw lots; one is to be offered up in the Temple and the other is sent away to Azazel, the desert wastelands. Aharon is to take a pan of coals and incense into the Holy of Holies, with the smoke of the incense enveloping the covering of the Aron (the Ark).

This is reminiscent of Mount Sinai, where God 'descended' in a cloud and gave us the Ten Commandments. Aharon takes the blood of his sin offering and sprinkles it seven times in the Holy of Holies and seven times in front of the curtain outside the Holy of Holies. He repeats this with blood of the people's sin-offering, the one of the goats. Aharon then places his hands upon the head of the other goat and beseeches God for forgiveness for the sins of the people, 'placing them on the head of the goat'.

This second goat is then led out to the desert. Aharon changes from the special white garments to his regular ones and offers up the other offerings of the day.

This entire procedure is carried out once a year. Although Yom Kippur is a Yomtov, the restrictions of Shabbat apply. The High Priest was to atone firstly for himself and his family, then for the priesthood as a whole and then for the nation of Israel.
