News and Views

Most of this reading is about the reconciliation between God and Israel following the sin of the Golden Calf. God 'descends' to Mount Sinai, passes in front of Moshe - who is concealed in the 'cleft of the rock' - and declares the thirteen principles of His mercy.

The reading concludes with the obligation of Israel to 'go up and appear before God' on the festivals of Pesach, Shavuot and Succot.

The Megillah of Kohelet (ShabbatChol Hamoed)

Tradition has it that King Solomon wrote Kohelet (Ecclesiastes) in his later years. An extremely wise man, he cautions against striving after the fleeting pleasures of this world. The day that Kohelet was read outside Israel last year was 7 October. Rabbi Doron Perez, whose one son, Daniel, was killed in battle and other son, Yonatan, was injured but survived and was married ten days later, quoted the words from Kohelet, 'a time to mourn and a time to dance' saying "It is possible to do both at the same time".

This Succot, as we reflect on the tragic events of the last year on this festival of simcha, Kohelet shows us how to do exactly that.
