News and Views

This week's sedra of Ki Teitze stands out with its abundance of mitzvot - 74 to be exact. This single sedra contains more than any other sedra in the Torah.

The first aliyah opens with a challenging rule which discusses the permissibility of taking a female captive in war and marrying this woman. Following this, the Torah moves on to the area of inheritance and the rule of a double portion which is received by the oldest male child.

The sedra then moves on to speak of various situations in which one comes to the aid of their fellow man. For example, quickly burying a corpse, the mitzvah to return a lost object to the owner, and helping a neighbour whose animal is struggling from lifting a heavy load. The well known mitzvah of sending away the mother bird before taking the chicksfor eggs is found this week and famously promises long life for those who abide by this dictum. In the third aliyah we find two examples of mitzvot that relate to the clothing and how we dress. Namely, there is a prohibition to

KI TEITZEI wear clothing which contains a mixture of wool and linen - shatnez. Additionally, we find the mitzvah of wearing tzitzit.

The sedra ends with the well known mitzvah to remember
Amalek and their evil actions against young and vulnerable people. In an act of terror they
ambushed the Israelites as they left Egypt at a time when they were faint and exhausted.'
Not only was this an attack on the people of Israel, even worse, Amalek showed special
contempt for God.

It is for this reason that they are to be more despised than any other nation that waged war against Israel.
