On the last day of his life, Moshe gathers every member of the nation, of all ages. He enters them into a covenant with God, which will be binding for future generations too.

Moshe warns them against idolatry. Forsaking the covenant will result in the Land being destroyed and the nation being exiled. If the nation does indeed stray and finds itself in exile, it will return to God wholeheartedly. God will have mercy upon the people and bring them in from wherever they have been 'scattered'.

Standing in front of the nation, Moshe tells Yehoshua not to be afraid. Moshe writes the entire Torah and gives the scroll to the Kohanim and the elders. Moshe instructs the people in a new mitzvah, just after the end of every seventh year of the agricultural cycle on Succot, all the people are to gather in Jerusalem, young and old, to hear the king read parts of the Torah.
